<p>Learn to read and spell these words: - water, where, who, again, thought</p> <p>Can you write some sentences which use these words and check you have spelt them correctly? Remember to use neat, cursive handwriting.</p>	<p><u>I can add numbers to 20 and beyond</u></p> <p>Can you add two 2-digit numbers together?</p> <p>You could use a number line to help you, or a hundred square.</p> <p>Eg.</p> <p>13+12=</p> <p>19+15=</p> <p>18+8=</p>	<p>Can you keep a weather diary?</p> <p>During topic this term we are going to be looking closely at the weather and comparing it to the weather in other continents. Your task is to keep a weather diary of the weather where you live. This could be a daily recording of the weather each day for a week or two weeks.</p> <p>You can present this diary in any form; you could draw the weather, write what it is like or create the diary on a computer.</p> <p>Watch the weather report on television, to find out about how they talk about the weather.</p>  

During phonics and mental maths sessions your child will be assessed to ensure they are able to apply the skills taught through the English and maths homework. Your weather diary will be due in school by **Friday 24th January**.
