All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Free School Meals under the Government's universal Free School Meal system.

All pupils in Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 will have to pay for

school dinners (unless entitled to Free School meals).

If your circumstances have changed and you feel you may be entitled to Free School Meals please click here to see If you are eligible and apply online. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils may also be entitled to Free School Meals under this scheme – which entitles the school to additional funds and can also result in additional benefits to the family throughout the year.

If you are already in receipt of Free School Meals there is no need to reapply.

Year 1 have been investigating materials this week. We have sorted them into groups thinking about their different properties. We have also been scientists and tested a range of materials to see which were the most absorbent.





For English we have begun to explore Roald Dahl's Fantastic Mr Fox and hope to do some role play next week.

# **Durham Class**

What a fantastic first week it has been in Durham! The children are settling in brilliantly and have been working hard. We began the week by carrying out a science experiment to see the effects of oil spills in water. The children investigated whether absorption, removal or cleaning would be the most effective method to improve the conditions of the water, just like people do with our oceans.

In English, we have been exploring our text "Floodland" by Marcus Sedgwick. The children loved finding out about Zoe, our main character, and the troubles she is facing with the rising water levels. We have developed our knowledge of relative pronouns and expanded noun phrases, which the children used in a character description. They have also been developing their understanding of adverbials of time, which they will use within their narrative writing next week.
