Parent Voice Spotlight!

<u>You said:</u> poor behaviour is not always dealt with and those children behaving are not always celebrated. Classroom behaviour can have a negative effect on the classroom and there isn't always consistency in how behaviour is dealt with.

What we are doing: over the next 2 weeks we will be implementing a new behaviour policy at Rusthall St Paul's. Every classroom and playground should be a calm environment where every child can develop and learn. Good behaviour and discipline in schools is crucial if children are to learn and reach their full potential, and our best schools share a tireless focus on supporting that. Poor behaviour in a classroom can result in lost learning time for children. That's why we think it's so important to tackle poor behaviour; so teachers are able to provide high quality teaching to all. Please read the policy that is being sent out via email so you are aware of the changes. We will be introducing this to the children next week.

Chance to Shine Cricket

Last week I met with Sandra Hepple from Chance to Shine. She will be delivering a Cricket programme which is fully funded and there is no cost to the school. She will come in 1 whole day per week, working with 4 classes for a six-week term working alongside the teachers for 1 term. She will also be available for staff development, creating cricket play leaders and offering opportunities for children to experience cricket outside of curriculum time by working with the local cricket club.

Forest School

Year 6 enjoyed another lovely session in the woods today. We played a game called Find the Tree which involved leading another person who was blindfolded, to a tree and back again. Once the blindfold was removed, they had to find their tree. Not an easy task! They showed great respect and care for each other during this task, to ensure their partner didn't fall! The children then had to identify the tree and then make a woodland gnome from clay using only parts of that tree to decorate.

The children also used palm drills to make holes in wood cookies. We saw lots of creative ideas such as wood cookie person, a hanging decoration and a pineapple!

They enjoyed developing their shelters from last week and making nests for the birds.

York Class



This week Year 1 have been working on a textiles unit, we have been learning how to sewing using a running stitch. This week we have designed bags for the 3 Little Pigs and begun to join 2 pieces of material together to make the structure for our bag.

Exeter Class



In English this week, Exeter class have been exploring a text called The Wolf's Secret. They have spent time thinking about the use of language and the effect this has on the reader but also considering how the pictures in a book can affect and change the meaning of a story. They have also been reading

Hello, Harvest Moon during guided reading. In Math's they have been looking at the value of each digit in numbers up to 99,000 and using this to both order and compare them

using the greater than and less than symbols. We have also been hard at work rehearsing ready for the Harvest Festival on Monday!

Durham Class

This week in Durham, we have been exploring and identifying the features of play scripts. After reading and annotating a selection of play scripts to help us identify the features, the children then had a go at writing their own play script based on one of the chapters within our book 'Floodland'. I was so impressed by the children's use of punctuation and stage directions. They also applied their knowledge of relative clauses, by including them in the dialogue within their play scripts. We have kick-started our Science topic of 'Animals Including Humans' this week, where the children have started to develop their knowledge of key scientific vocabulary, such as, atrium, ventricle and arteries.
