#### **Inspire MAT Support and Training**

This week we completed a safeguarding audit to ensure that all processes and procedures are in place and up to date. I am pleased to say they are, but we are continually looking for ways to improve and are making some tweaks and adjustments – expectations around communication for the collection of children being one of them. The staff were celebrated this week for the amazing time and effort they have put into the changes that I have already put in place. They have all changed their learning environments which is having a positive impact on learning and they are implementing the new behaviour policy and low level behaviours are decreasing. Additionally, the teachers took time to reflect on the training they received last week about a new approach to guided reading which will re-ignite the children's love of reading and support all pupils. The data proves that this approach supports the progress of children at every level and they have been planning for the implementation of this after half term.

# **York Class**

**EYFS** 

This week in Maths, we have been exploring how to identify and sort shapes, with focus on the features of triangles and circles. Within English, we have started our new book 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We launched this by having our own bear hunt through the school, even finding footprints!

### **Exeter Class**

This week Exeter class have been finishing their weaving topic, completing their mini blanket designs. I have been thoroughly amazed by their attention to detail and perseverance as this had been a really hard skill to learn.

In maths, they have been moving onto addition and subtraction using number bonds to support quick calculation. Now we are moving on to the expanded method so that we understand how the process works. Ask your children to show you how to do this at home

This Week: 90% This Year: 92.13% as it takes a bit of practice and builds on the place value skills that we practiced at the beginning of the year.

In English, the children have been writing Haikus and have even published their final copy on Thursday. We will be displaying some of these in the class and KS2 corridor.

#### Year 5

As some of the Year 6 children were off on their residential, the Year 5s came together and enjoyed a few days of learning as one class. We have been exploring more of our printing topic together, and the children loved getting to design and make their own block prints.

They began by tracing an image and printing it onto a foam board. They



then carved out their designs and used block paint and a roller to paint their foam board, before placing it into their books and printing their image. The children were incredibly proud of their designs and prints. We were also very lucky to get a full day of Forest School together. I was so proud of the children for the way they supported one another and for the creativity they demonstrated.
