Staff Development and Training

On Tuesday, the teachers and governors had a meeting, led by the Executive Head Teacher Mrs Mitchell, about our school values. Whenever there is new leadership in a school, they will look at the values as they play a pivotal role in shaping the moral and academic landscape of educational institutions. By teaching and consistently modelling these values, schools not only shape the character of their students but also support the holistic development of each child. When a school has a well-defined system of values, it serves as a benchmark for various facets of school life. This includes the manner in which teaching staff interact with students and the behaviours they exemplify. Such a strong emphasis on school values makes every member more conscious of their accomplishments, pushing them to excel in all dimensions of school life. We wanted to look carefully at what is at the heart of Rusthall St Paul's and make sure that our school values mirror this. This will then permeate throughout the school and help us move forward on our journey.

We will be sharing the outcome of the meeting with you once we have used the values to structure the Vision Statement for the school.

School Uniform

I have previously shared the school uniform on the newsletter as a reminder about what children need to be wearing. On uniform days, most of the children are attending in full uniform, including ties and jumpers, which is amazing. Research shows that 'a uniform means students don't have to worry about peer pressure when it comes to their clothes. When everyone is dressed the same, worrying about what you look like is not so important. There is no competition about being dressed in the latest trend, which would put a great deal of financial pressure on students and parents.'

On PE days, it is most noticeable that children and families are not following the uniform policy. Therefore, I would like to remind everyone that on PE days, children need to be in the correct uniform:

School House Colour T-shirt (not baggy style please) Navy shorts (not baggy style please) Plimsolls or trainers

Tracksuit or tracksuit trousers and sweatshirt is advisable for winter months from year 1 upwards

We will be starting to send uniform slip home with children who are not wearing the correct attire. Please do let us know if you are unable to source uniform or need financial support as this is something we are more than happy to help with.

Attendance

As you are aware from my previous newsletters, every week we monitor the attendance levels of pupils within the school. We have a duty to report the attendance figures to the local authority. On the 15th November, the attendance officer for our local area will be attending the school and I will have to

report both whole school figures and individual pupil's attendance. At this point, the local authority will then have to follow their procedures. Please use this link on the steps that can be taken under the government guidance: School

Our whole school attendance is currently at 93.34%. In order for children to receive a good education they need to be in school a minimum of 97%. Please come and speak to us if you need support with your child attending school.

York Class

This week in York Class we have been learning to retell the story of "We're going on a bear hunt." Reception and year 1 have been working together daily to retell the story. We have also learnt what a refrain is and in small groups we practised performing the refrain "We're going on a bear hunt. We're going to catch a big one. What a beautiful day. We're not scared." In maths we have been working on composition of numbers. Reception have been looking at how numbers to 3 can be composed. We used animals and placed them in fields - describing each number, for example 2 is made of 2 and 0. Year 1 have been learning to use the addition symbol to record thave been learning to use the addition symbol to record statements to match pictures. We applied our knowledge and found different record the picture flowers.	
Winchester Class We have had a lovely first week back in Winchester class. In English, we have studied the characters in our story 'The Princess and the White Bear King' and we have written character descriptions of the princess. In RE, we have started our new topic of 'Incarnation' and we thought about why Christmas is important to Christians. (We look forward to starting our nativity soon!) Exeter Class Exeter class thoroughly enjoyed their cricket coaching session and were very pleased that the weather held out long enough for this to be done outside. Sandra the coach mentioned what a pleasure it was to work with the children and how enthusiastic they are. It was another 'first' for Exeter this week, with their first session of forest school. Despite the efforts of Storm Ciaran to make it an indoor session, the children did get outside and had a fantastic time. I hope that next week it will be a little less windy! Durham This week in Durham we began our new key text "Stay Where You Are Then Leave," which is linked to our upcoming WW2 topic in History. The children have worked really hard to develop their skills in using passive voice, identifying different tenses and using precise vocabulary to engage the reader. They have also enjoyed participating in their first cricket lesson with Kent Cricket and I was very impressed by the strength of the children's batting and how far some of the balls travelled! Some of the children got lots of runs in for their teams. We have also consolidated our knowledge of printing this week and the children got to create their own lino prints which were inspired by their knowledge of relief printing! In gymnastic we recapped what a balance was then added a twist, literally! I was blown away by the focus, attitude and flexibility of the class! Working in small groups they put together a (not so simple in some cases) sequence which
