Staff Development and Training

This week we looked at the pupils reading. As a staff we wanted to tackle the issue of record keeping of home reading and how to develop the children's love of reading. The plan moving forwards will be:

EYFS and KS1 will continue to record their daily reading on class dojo in their portfolios. They get a dojo point for each time they read and the teachers will set targets for how many points we want to collect. All children who read every day will be put into a raffle at the end of the term to win a reading prize.

KS2 are going to introduce reading records. Children/families will be expected to record reading at home daily. The class teacher or teaching assistant will check reading records daily to keep a log of who is reading. We can also communicate through the reading record about levels and targets. The children will get a house point for every time they read.

Love of reading – we will be doing 15 mins a week in KS1 where the children will just read for pleasure. This will not be levelled books but just a book either from the class or library that they want to read. KS2 will complete 30 mins a week. The teachers are very excited to read some of their books during this time too!

We have more ideas for the rest of the year to continue to develop reading but these things will be implemented in the next 2 weeks to get us started. Get in touch if you want more information or you have any questions.

The mud kitchen was popular as usual and some fun games were created, including jumping onto a plank to make a jug of water fly high into the air! We finished the session with a relaxing sit spot and gave thanks to nature with some bird food.

York Class

This week in Inspired Play, Reception have shown a keen interest in acting out birthday parties. Therefore, we through a birthday party for the teddy bear in our class. The children used their number knowledge to 5 to choose birthday stickers, they used their phonic knowledge to write birthday cards, wrapped presents to improve their

gross motor skills and even made pretend cakes in our Home Corner.

Year 1 have been incredible this week and we are so proud of them. We have been focused on story writing, ensuring they orally form

their sentence, count the words, write it down, use a full stop and then

check their own sentence. We have seen such progress in their independent learning skills. Well done Year 1!

Winchester Class





Winchester have continued to be very busy and focused in their learning. In PE they have been loving their cricket sessions on a Tuesday afternoon and have already learnt how to use a bat and this week moved on to bowling under and over arm. They all mastered these skills really well and we are already identifying budding cricketers of the future! The class have been very excited about our art sessions and we have been learning the skills needed to work with clay. They have been looking at different ways to roll, squeeze, pinch and pull as well as how to smooth and create hollow shapes and scrape them out so the edges









are not too thick. We are all really looking forward to starting on our sculptures very soon.

Exeter Class

This week we have been studying news articles, and we have now begun writing our own. We are reading The Ion Man by Ted Hughes in our Guided Reading lessons, and next week we will find out what Hogarth's plan is to capture The Iron Man and keep the town safe. In Maths we have just started multiplication and division facts, and we are learning tricks to recognise multiples of 3.

We have also had lots of time outdoors this week. We had our Kent Cricket Coach visit us on Tuesday and teach us how to bowl with precision. We then got muddy at forest school and created our own poppies to show our respect for remembrance day on Friday.

Durham

This week in Durham we began our topic of World War 2 in History. The children successfully identified the different events that took place in the lead up to the war and used the evidence they looked at to identify what they thought was the biggest trigger for the war starting. I am so impressed with how engaged and enthused the children are by this topic and I'm really looking forward to seeing the outcomes over the next few weeks. In English, we have been exploring more of our text 'Stay where you are and then Leave.' We have been learning about multi-clause sentences and building on children's knowledge of how to use precise vocabulary to engage the reader. The children also thoroughly enjoyed their second Kent Cricket lesson, where they learnt further skills in controlling the ball, alongside how to accurately bowl.
