York Class

This week has been very busy in York Class. Year 1 have been working on applying their knowledge of instruction writing to write their own instructions to make a disgusting sandwich. The children were able to write independently and for a sustained period which has been great

using their phonics knowledge to write the sounds they can hear in words. We also visited the music room where we learnt about tuned and untuned instruments we explored a variety of instruments looking at how they were played. Our dress rehearsal to Key Stage One on Friday morning was a success and we can't wait for everyone to see the carol concert on Monday. We have been having a lot of fun practicing our reading and speaking skills with some very challenging tongue-twisters this week, and have just finished reading the Iron Man by Ted Hughes in guided reading. We had our final cricket session of the term on Tuesday and were amazed at how far we had come with our cricket skills in only six sessions. In Maths we completed arithmetic challenges and learned the rules for dividing and multiplying numbers by 1, 0, and itself. We are now on Chapter 3 of our biographies and are looking forward to editing, improving, and publishing them next week.

Durham

This week in Durham, we have been exploring formal letter writing and the children did an excellent job of identifying the features of a formal letter, before using their knowledge to write their own letters in role as Alfie (the main character from our text 'Stay Where You Are Then Leave'). In History, we have been developing our knowledge of what evacuation was like during WW2. The children identified who would have been evacuated, what they would have been allowed to take with them and they then compared different primary and secondary sources with a focus on their reliability. In P.E, the children continued to build on their knowledge of how to play cricket and the skills which are needed. They focused this week on using clear and strong communication, when working as part of a team.

Rochester

Wow, what another whirlwind of a week. We have got stuck into biographies and have impressed Miss Collis with our research skills. We have been thinking carefully how to structure our work in chronological order and creating something that will hook someone into reading it.

This term year 6 have been brushing up on their first aid skills. This week we practised putting someone in the recovery position if the were unconscious but breathing. This week we have had our final gymnastic lesson where

we combined all of the skills we have learned over the past few weeks into a final performance. We considered: how to work as a team and stay in time; how to move between our balances; how to incorporate counter balances and include our whole team; and how to create a polished
